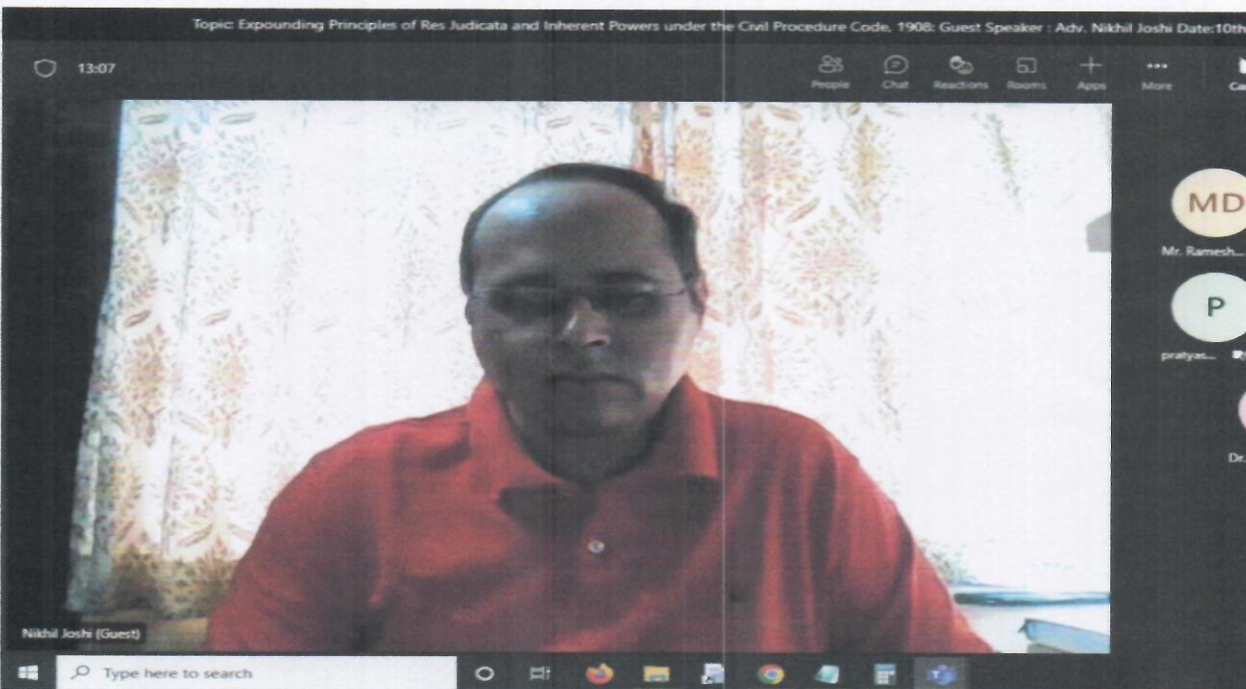

In furtherance of this objective, the institute organized a Guest Lecture on '**Expounding Principles of Res Judicata and Inherent Powers under the Civil Procedure Code, 1908**' on 10th May 2022. The Speaker for the event was **Advocate Nikhil Joshi**, practicing lawyer before Bombay High Court, Nagpur Bench.

The event was conducted under the guidance of **Dr.Sukhvinder Singh Dari**, Director, Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur.

Advocate Nikhil Joshi addressed the participants about various aspects of *res judicata* as provided under Section 11 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908. He explained the concepts of the principle with various examples and case laws for easy understanding of the students. He analysed the difference between the doctrines of *res judicata* and *res sub judice*. He also explained the conditions necessary for application of *res judicata* and the concept of constructive *res judicata*.

The session also covered the provision of Section 151 of the Code of Civil Procedure which provides for Inherent Powers of the Court. The speaker discussed the importance of the provision for meeting the ends of justice and the judicial interpretations that have been made in this regard.

The lecture was followed by a Q&A session in which the students inquired about the practical application of provisions of res judicata and inherent powers of the court among other questions. The session was moderated by **Vaishnavi Dwivedi**, student at Symbiosis Law School Nagpur. The lecture was well received by all the participants.
