National Workshop On 'Allied Criminal Laws'

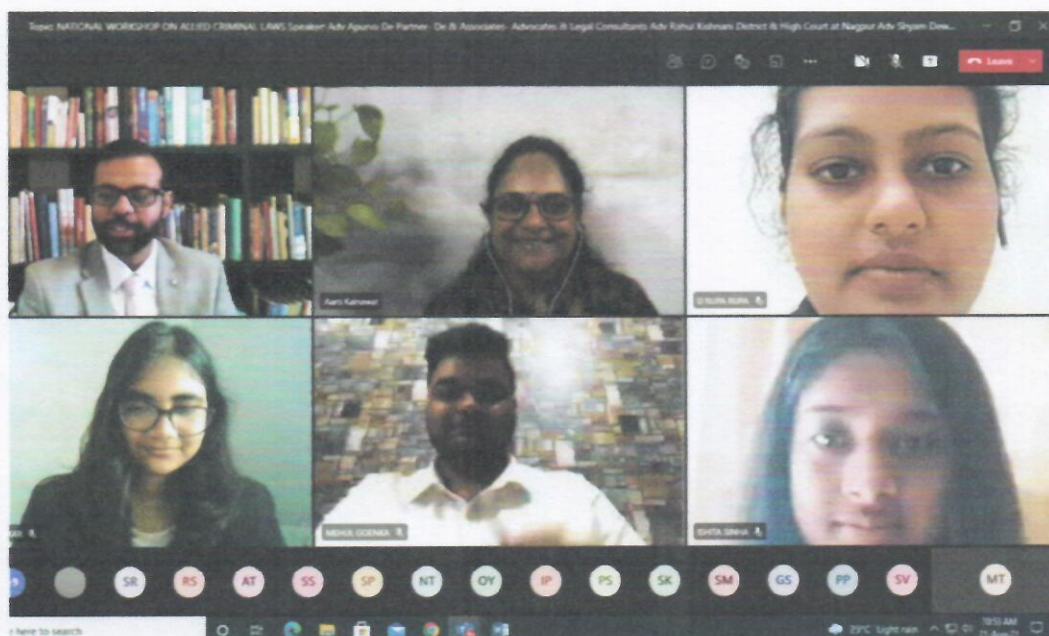

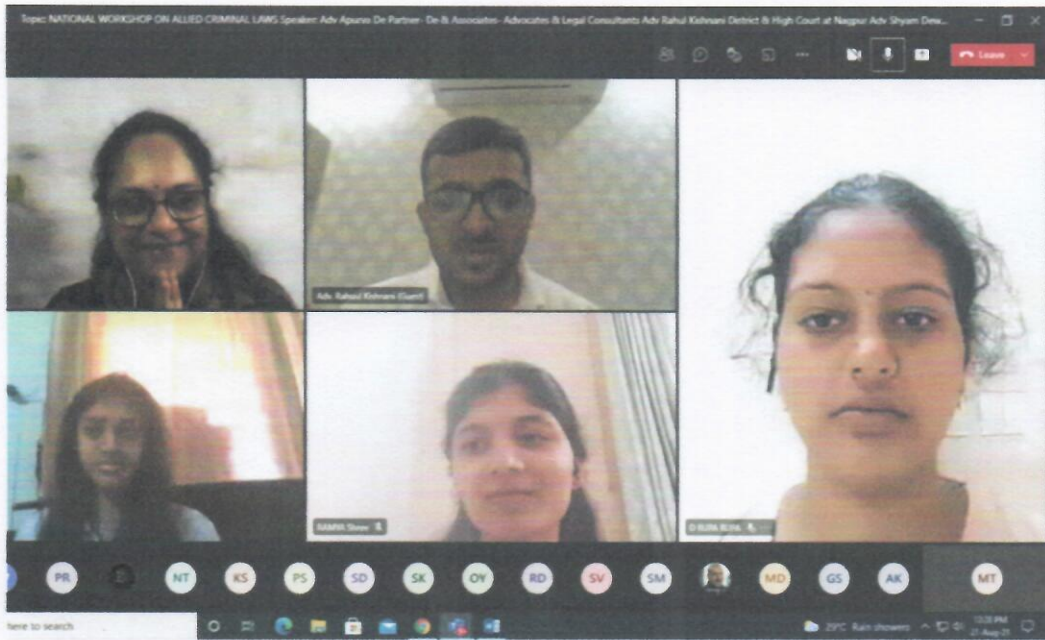


