## International Virtual Conference on Women Rights in Developing Countries: Issues and Challenges

## 15th May 2022

The Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur in collaboration with Jus Corpus organized a Virtual International Conference on 'Women Rights in Developing Countries: Issues and Challenges' on 15th May 2022. The objective of this International Conference was to provide a global platform for academicians, professionals, researchers, students, and other stakeholders to discuss and provide solutions to a variety of issues and operational challenges associated with the women's rights in the developing countries and also to suggest the way forward in tackling them. Nearly hundred abstracts were received and and out of them 70+ were shortlisted for submission of full paper and presentation including the papers from United Kingdom and Bangladesh.

The Inaugural Session witnessed the enlightening addresses of Justice Deepa Sharma (Retd.), Member, National Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission and Mr. Tariq Khan, Registrar, International Arbitration and Mediation Centre, Hyderabad. The session was moderated by Mr. Ayush Pandey and Ms. Sakshi Batham of Jus Corpus. Dr. Sukhvinder Singh Dari, Director, Symbiosis Law School Nagpur extended the welcome address and highlighted the importance of the conference on such an important topic.

Mr. Tariq in his address raised various issues faced by the women in our country and other developing countries. He raised them one by one and highlighted the fact that despite having the legal recourse against them, they are still prevalent which is simply because of the lack of proper implementation. He discussed with the help of various examples from his daily life at court and workplaces that how at certain points the women are looked not at par with men. He concluded his session with words of caution. He stated that women one refrain themselves from filing frivolous complaints as at the end of the day it affects the one who are in fact the victim of crimes.

Justice Deepa Sharma started her address by signifying the importance of realizing women rights in the developing countries. She addressed that what women rights exactly stands for and what important role they play in the development of a nation. She touched upon various statutes enacted for the women along with the international instruments and also highlighted the role of the judiciary in realizing the women's rights. She concluded her address by suggesting various measures which may be undertaken to tackle the problems faced by the women in developing countries.

The Vote of Thanks was extended by Prof. Ahmar Afaq, Assistant Professor at Symbiosis Law School Nagpur.

The Inaugural session was followed by seven technical sessions which were divided sub-theme wise. Four technical session were conducted parallel in the morning session and the rest three were conducted post lunch. The resource persons from divergent law colleges from all over the country and even abroad, discussed each paper and deliberated upon it with the presenters and other participants available. The conference was concluded by reading of the conference report and the thank you note for all those who made it possible.


