FIRST INTRA-CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATION COMPETITION TEHKEQAAT BY SYMBIOSIS CENTRE FOR CRIMINOLOGY AND FORENSIC SCIENCE.

Date: 19th & 20th March, 2024

DAY 1: WORKSHOP:

Symbiosis Centre for Criminology and Forensic Science hosted a workshop on Crime Scene Investigation on 19th March 2024 at 3.00 pm onwards. The workshop was on the basics of Crime Scene Investigation by Adv. Prateek Kubade (resource person), who holds expertise in Forensic Science, medical negligence cases, and defense law. He has supported as the main resource person in this event and the cell is thankful to him for the same.

The purpose of this workshop was to brief the students about how a forensic expert deals with a crime scene when he first enters the scene post receiving information regarding the crime. In the workshop, Adv. Prateek directed the students to maintain proper conduct once they enter the crime scene so that they do not contaminate it. The students were made aware of the numerous tools that should be used to prevent the contamination of the evidence available at the crime scene.

This was an interactive workshop and the participants were answering questions asked. The participants also eagerly asked doubts to Adv. Prateek which were well answered by him also through demonstration. The demonstration made it easier for the students to understand the topic better and the reasons behind some scientific facts.

On the same day, the draw of lots was conducted till 5.00 pm according to which the teams had been allotted the time slots for the competition day.



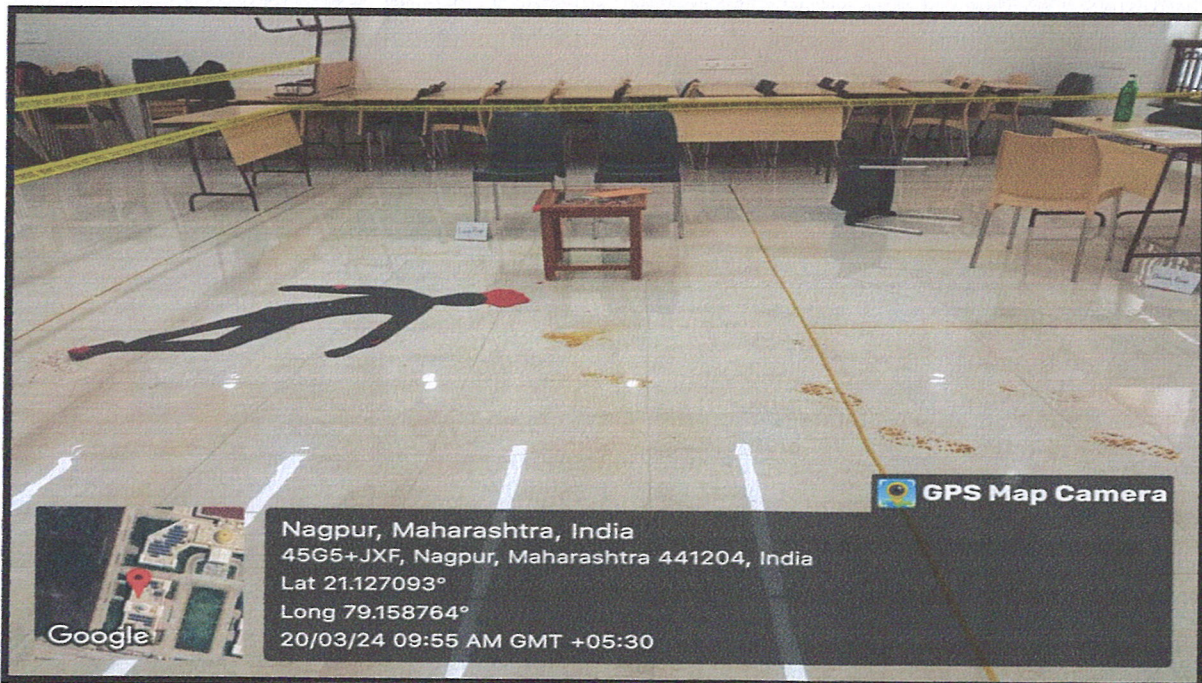
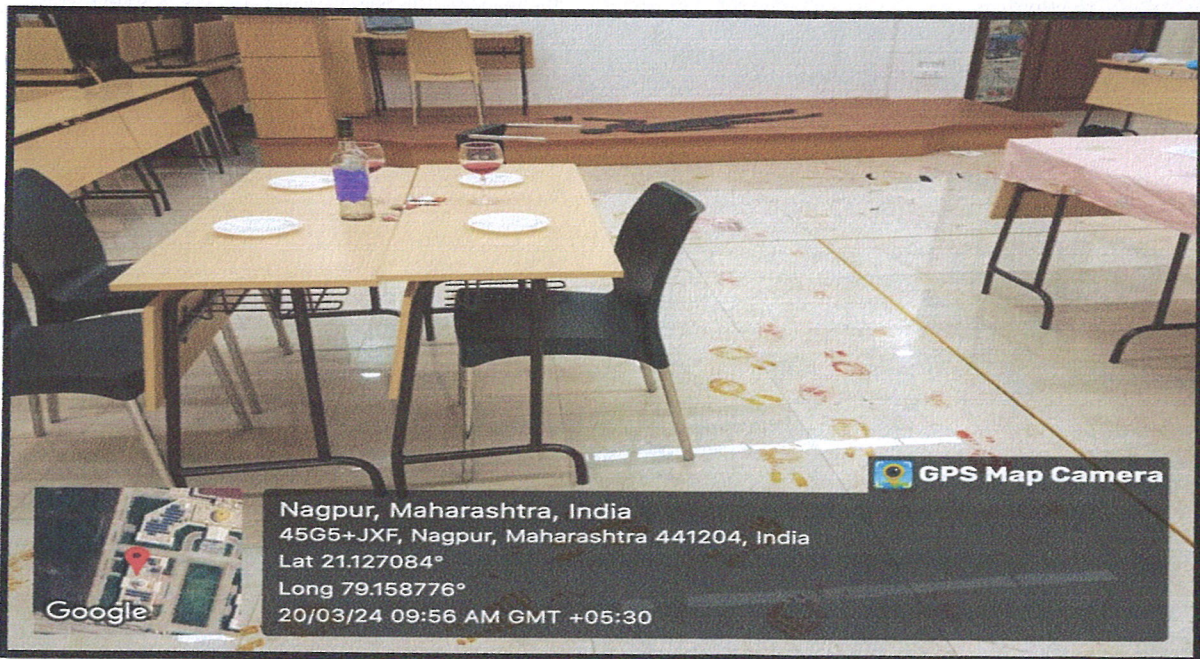

Crime Scene Investigation: Tehkeqaat Competition on 20th March, 2024

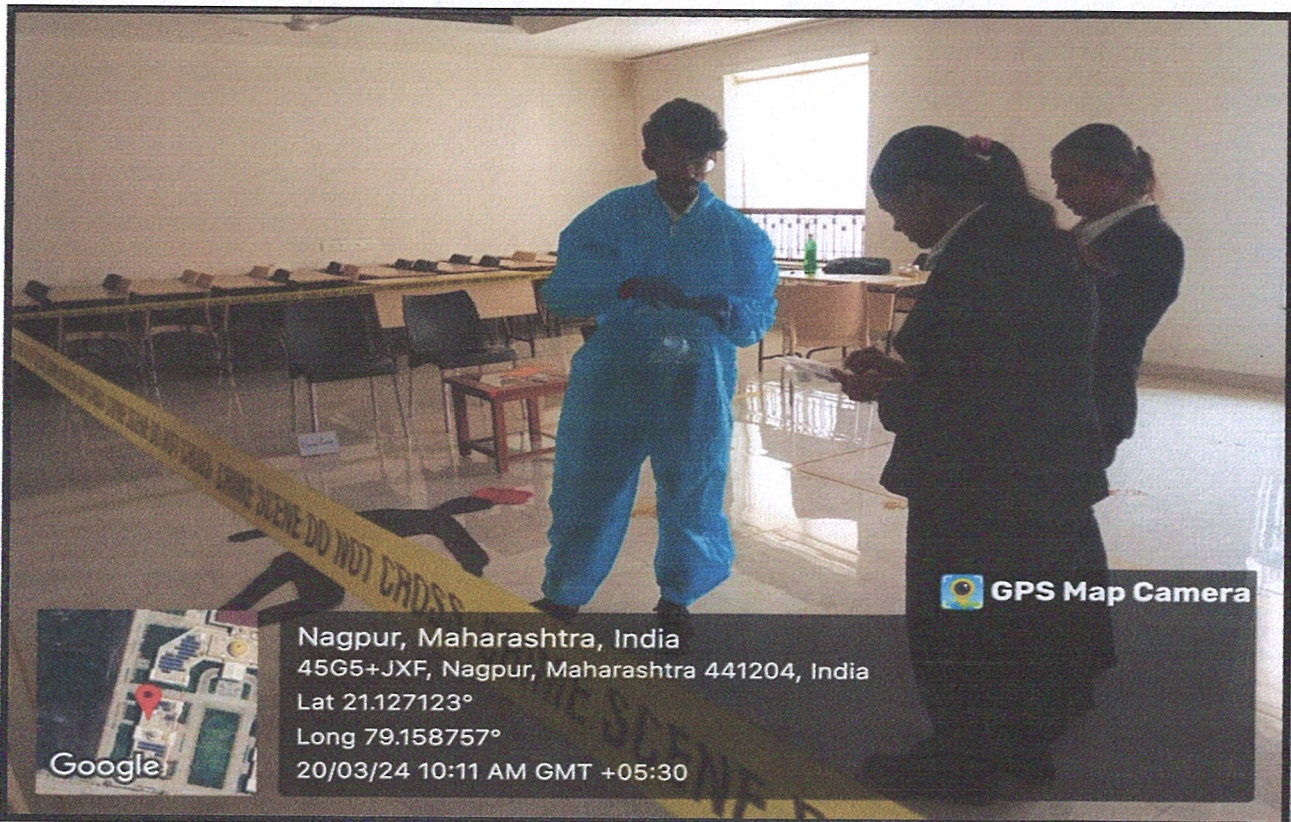
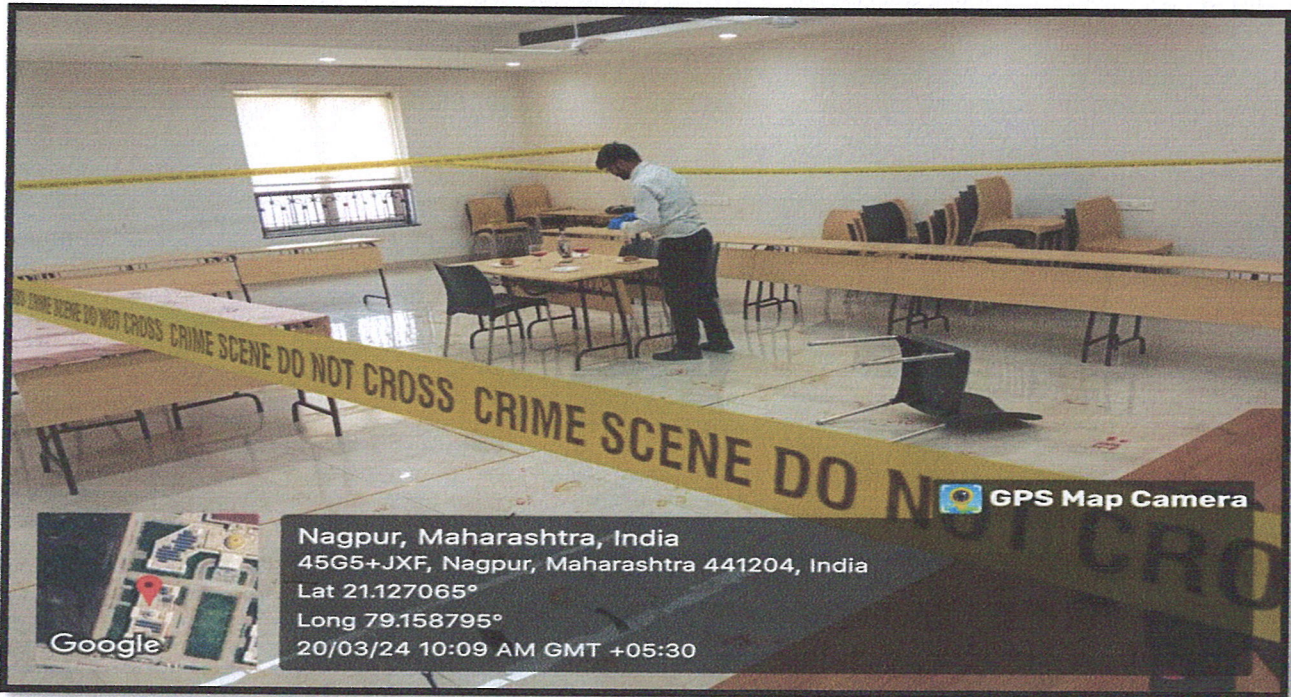
The event attracted an overwhelming response, with 42 teams comprising 126 participants in total. The competition began at 10.00 am and the first teams arrived on time. The teams were instructed before they entered the crime scene on the time limit of 15 minutes per team and some other general instructions. Upon entering the room, they were asked to identify the tools in the kit by answering a series of questions. The time would begin as soon as they were handed the kit. Post 15 minutes' participants were directed to the report writing room. They were allotted 30 minutes to complete the report in which they had to mention the modus operandi and the cause of death according to their observation at the crime scene and the evidence collected. The dining room on the 2nd floor of the SLS building was the report writing room. During the whole process, the phones of the participants were ceased except for the photographers of the crime scene. Before entering the report writing room also their phones were ceased and they were not allowed to refer to phones while writing reports. This process was carried on till lunchtime.

Post lunch also the event was smoothly executed and Prof. Prateek Kubade helped us in marking the participial. The event was a success under the guidance of Ms. Himanshi Bhatia (Faculty-in-charge). Thanks to all the participants for showing enthusiasm for this event.

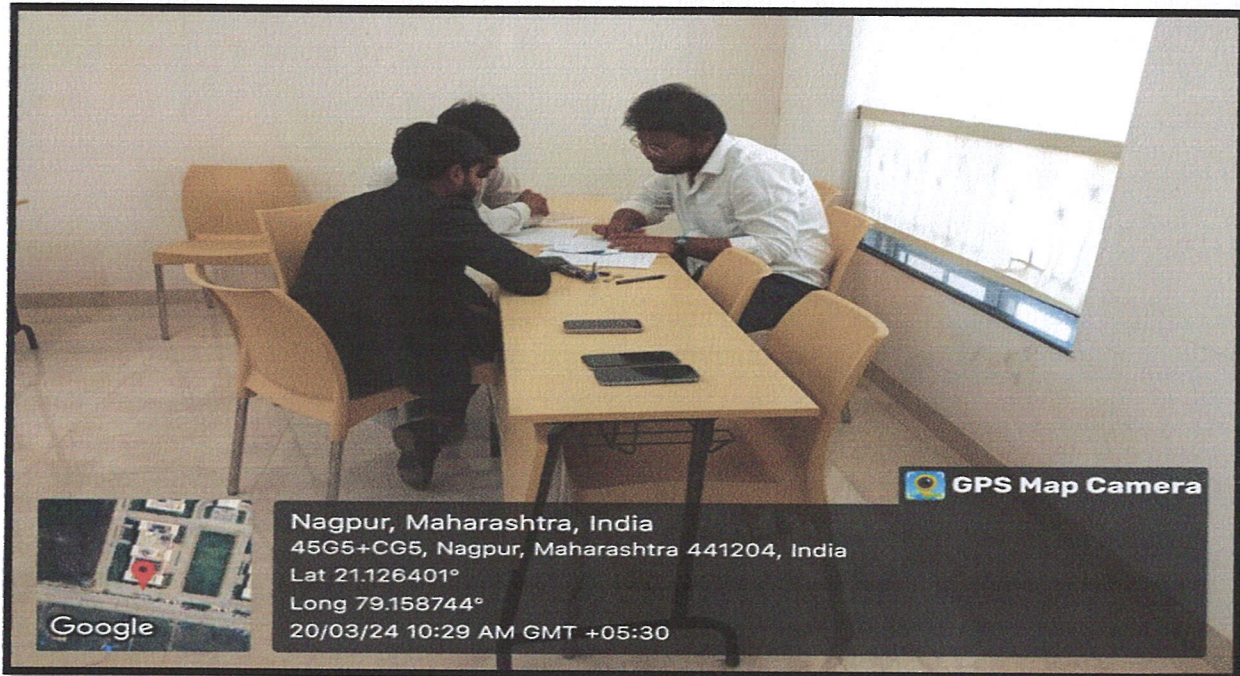
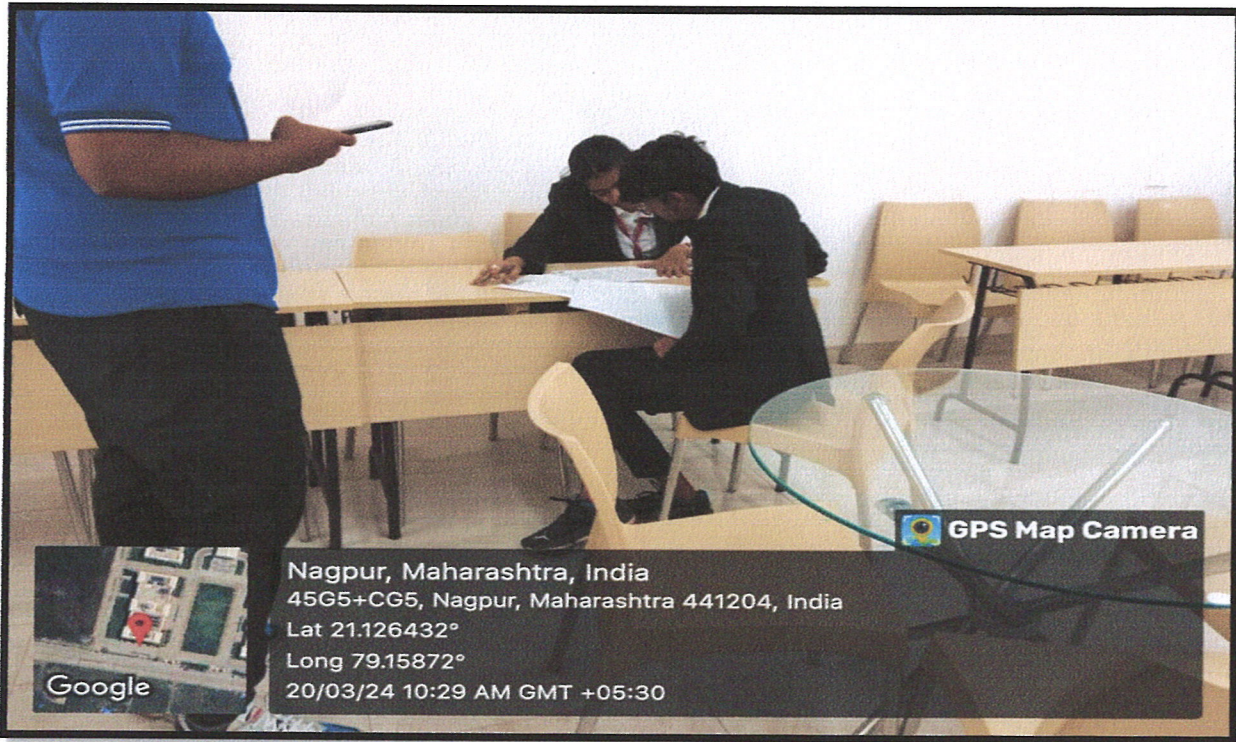
