Report on FIRST INTRA-COLLEGE MODEL UNITED NATION COMPETITION.

15th and 16th of March 2023

As part of its ongoing commitment to provide students with opportunities and exposure to various legal professional pursuits, the Debate and Literary Cell of Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur, organized an INTRA-COLLEGE MODEL UNITED NATION COMPETITION on a wide range of topics relating to national and international importance on the 15th and 16th of March 2023.

A simulation of United Nations procedures is known as Model United Nations (Model UN / MUN). Participants serve as UN delegates and engage in UN activities such as negotiations, discussions, and spirited debates.

The tournament's purpose was to teach students to the concepts, subtleties, and talents required to thrive in international affairs and to assist them in developing such qualities for all of their future endeavors as law students. Each law student must ultimately master the skill of successful debate and reasoning, and the Debate and Literary Cell at SLS Nagpur seeks to make this a reality for its students so that they can become specialists in the field.

The students learnt the significance of representation and study on critical subjects affecting international politics, as well as the skills required for a discussion. At the same time, students were educated on a wide range of topics, including politics, economics, media legislation, and parenting, to mention a few.

There were 3 committees in the competition, namely UNHRC, UNSC and AIPPM and all these committees had their respective agendas and criteria set for winners.

THE UNSC began in the presence of the Executive Board chaired by Advait Nisal and Avinash Das and Aatish Nigam. Session 1,2,3 marked the presence of 30 delegates in total. The GSL marked the presence and valuable contributions from Taliban, Russia, Afghanistan and USA.

The AIPPM committee began with the introductory opening statements by leaders of all political parties. The Executive Board chaired by Digvijay Nimbalkar, Prakhar Rathore and Neel Gokhale The ruling party leaders praised the various policies of the government and highlighted the benefits thereof. While, the opposition party leaders focused on drawbacks of the policies like demonetization, GST, Farm Laws, and CAA.

The second session of the day was focused on discussing mainly core legislations. There was an elaborate discussion on the UAPA Act. Arguments were made with respect to the act being arbitrary and draconian. Further the idea of prima facie guilt and reverse burden of proof under the UAPA were discussed at length. The ruling party leaders highlighted the need for stringent national security which was the reason behind the provisions of the UAPA.

In the last session, the question of granting contracts by the government and privatization thereof, was further questioned by the opposition. The committee ended with an over-all analysis of the agenda and an entertainment motion.

The UNHRC committee, which focused on the human rights conventions in relation to the RUSSIA- UKRAINE war focused on the situation of migrant laborer's rights as well the violation of basic human rights by the countries in the ongoing war event. The main focus was to question the International relations of other countries with Russia such as economic trades, MoUs, and naval exercises which question the support and concerns towards human rights executed by other countries. As questions of violation of human rights piled up on Russia, the former delegate chose to withdraw from the delegation and a few replacements for the same were made.

Remarkable questioning skills were performed by several delegates and kudos to chairs Shouvik Dutta and Raunaq Ali to uplift the delegates by regular guidance for better understanding and performance of the delegates.

Owing to the immense effort put forth by each competitor, this tournament ended with the announcement of the winners, committee wise

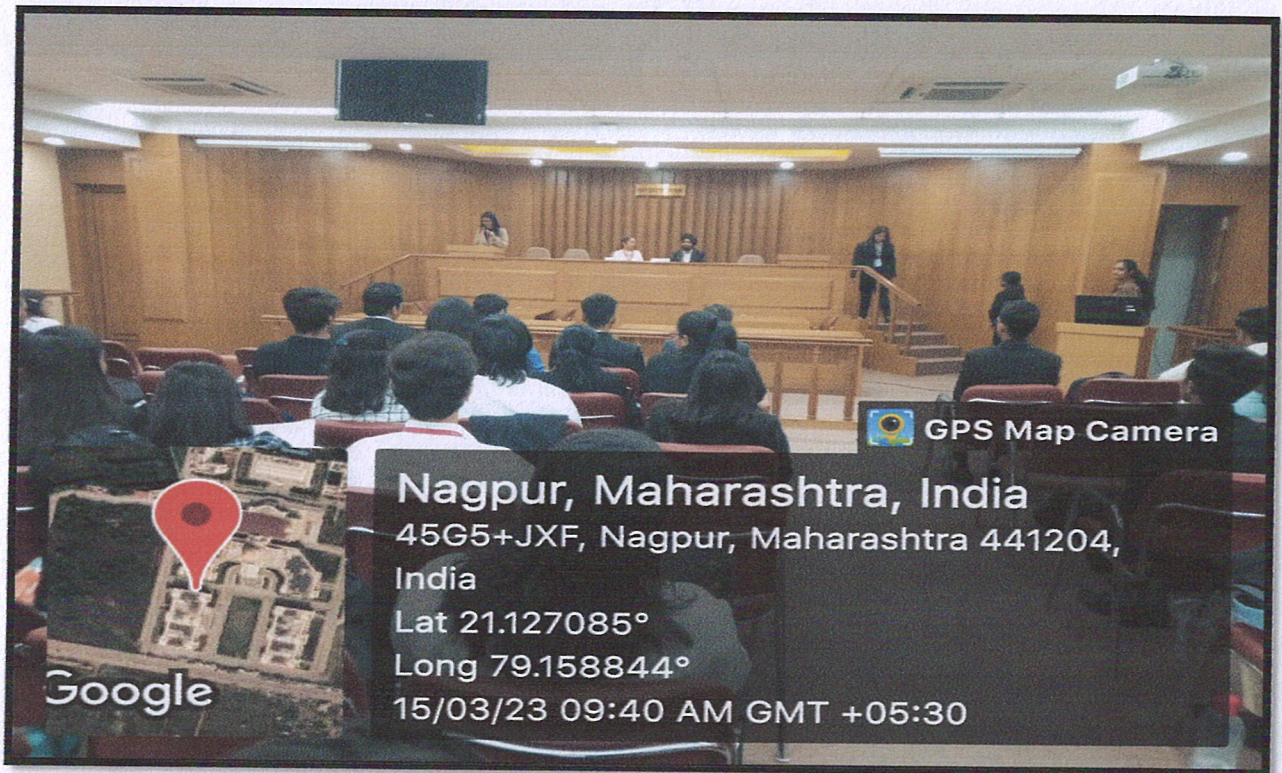
