The delegates representing various big-name corporations were held responsible for the respective actions taken by each corporation.

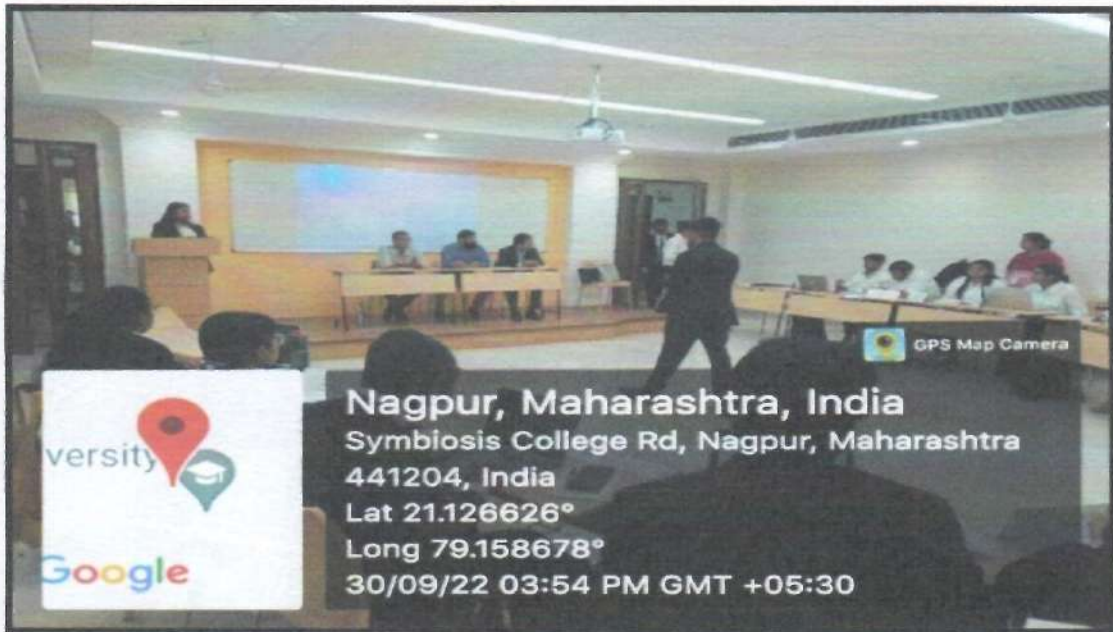
Technological Laws Committee:

The delegates raised the motion to discuss the general speakers list and a moderated caucus on currency or CBDC and IPR in relation to crypto currency.

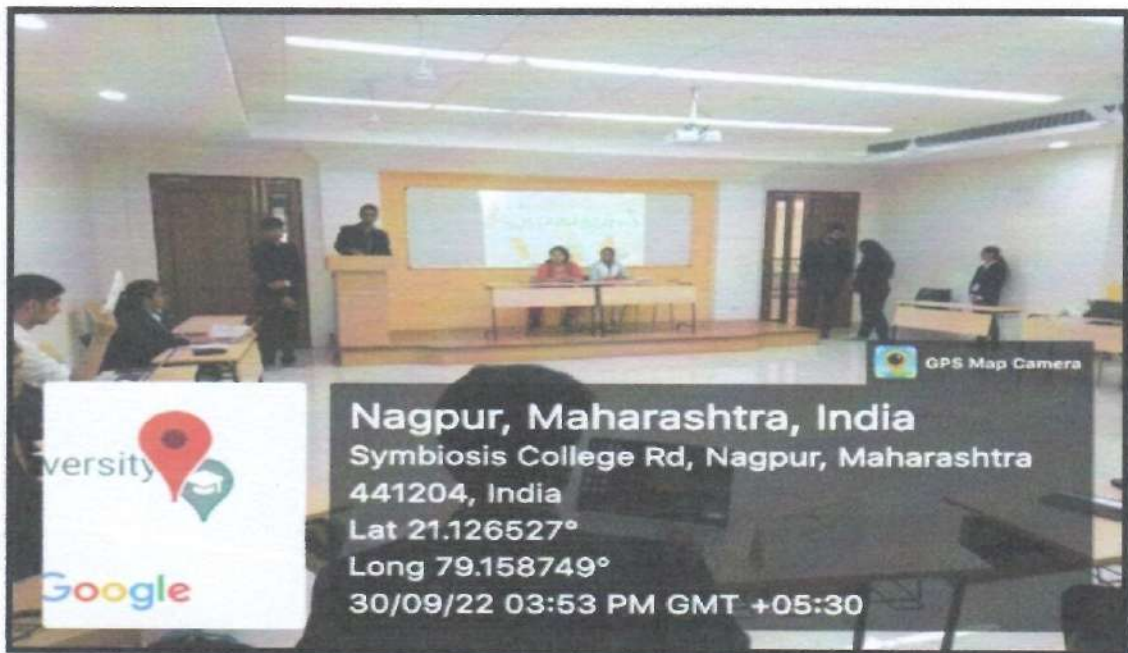
