Workshop on Rights of Disabled

20th September, 2022

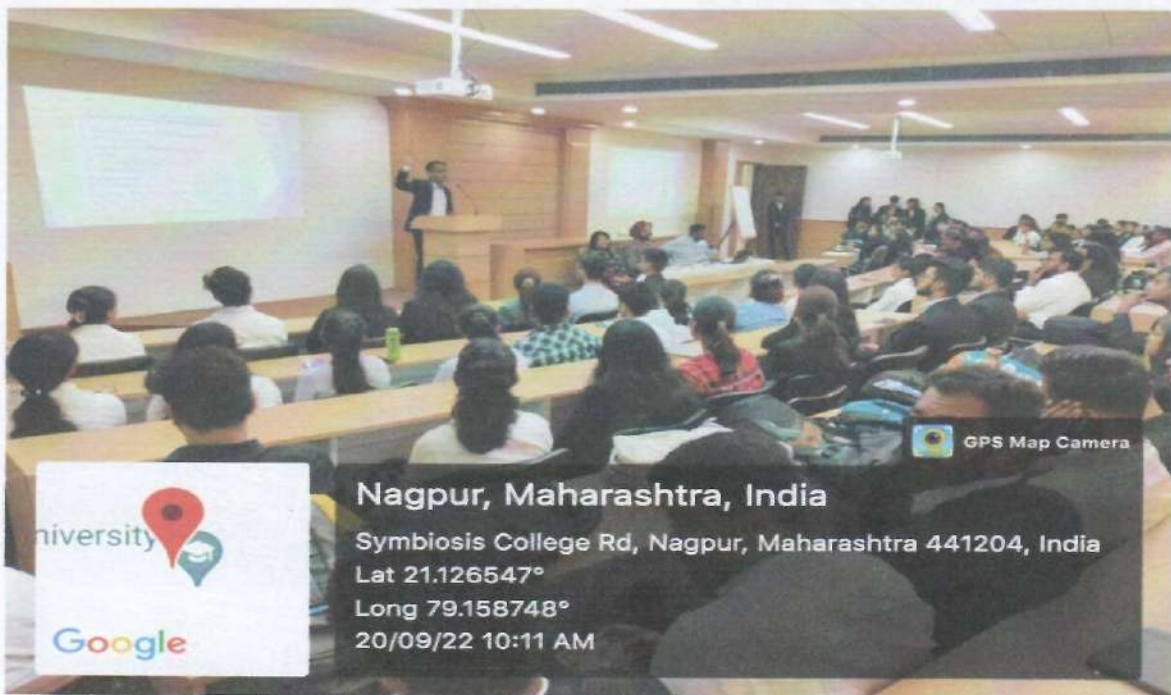
Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur, immediately after the inauguration of the pro bono club scheme of the department of justice, organized a workshop on rights of disabled in the assembly hall of the institute. The workshop began with the welcome address by Dr. Sukhvindar Singh Dari, Director, Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur. The chief guest and the resource person of the workshop were Mr. Arman Ali, Executive Director, National Centre or Promotion of Employment for Disabled People (NCPEDP), New Delhi and Mr. Akshay Jain, Program manager, NCPEDP. Dr. Sukhvindar Singh Dari explained the importance of the workshop on disabled and congratulated the students for opening the cell on rights of person with disability. The session started with the inauguration of the center for rights of person with disability.

Mr. Arman Ali, explained how people with disability are an integral part of our society and the opportunities and services available to them need to be assured in the same way as they are for citizens of India. He also pointed out that there is a lack of awareness about the rights and benefits of persons with disabilities.

Mr. Akshay Jain started his interaction with the meaning of disability and estimation of the status of persons with disability in southeast and other regions of India, disability with high support need and persons with bench mark disabilities. He explained that every disability has its own need. There are many challenges to ensure their rights such as

political pressures, budget not allowed, policies not implemented etc. Further accessibility to courts is also not easy because of unfriendly infrastructure. In many important places tactile path is not available. Tactile paths provide visually impaired people with secure directions for their walk road, open spaces and inside public buildings, courts, train station or subways, and airports. He also talked about the education policy and reservations for the disabled in educational institutions.

More than 300 participants registered and attended the workshop. The Session was conducted by Ms. Pranjal Pagaria Student in charge of the centre and Ms. Isaa Roy, student Co- Incharge of the centre under the guidance of Dr. Deepti Khubalkar, Faculty in charge. Members of centre worked hard for the success of the program.

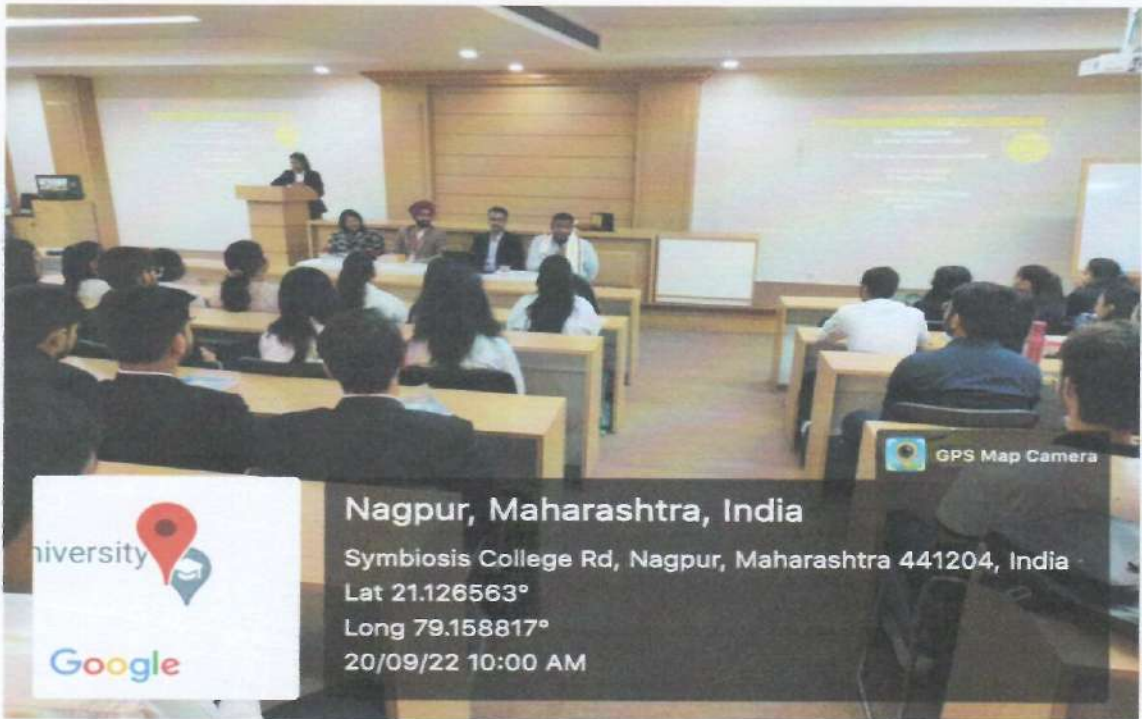
